# **Program criteria**

Our Community Grants Program helps make a difference in the lives of British Columbians by supporting the road safety and injury recovery / disability support initiatives of community organizations.

### **Road safety**

We consider initiatives, with special consideration for those that support ICBC's road safety programs and campaigns, that:

- make drivers and roads safer for all road users;
- improve the safety of vulnerable road users, including pedestrians, cyclists and children;
- help young people become responsible drivers;
- prevent auto crime; and/or
- provide resources to seniors to support them in their transition to no longer driving.

### Injury recovery / disability support

We consider initiatives that will help both our injured customers and other British Columbians recovering from an injury or living with a disability to live healthy, active and productive lives through rehabilitation services, support programs or access to information.

# Applying for a community grant

### **Eligibility**

To be eligible for grant funding, your initiative must:

- focus on, or enable ICBC's promotion of, road safety or injury recovery / disability support;
- · target one or more B.C. communities;
- be planned and delivered from an office in B.C.; and
- · benefit a significant number of B.C. residents.

Most grant recipients are non-profit community organizations, although we in some cases partner on or support the initiatives of other types of organizations.

Road safety infrastructure requests: Please contact your municipality and/or the B.C. Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure, either of which can submit an application to ICBC's Road Improvement Program.

Please note that eligibility does not guarantee a grant, as applications are considered as part of a competitive process.

The following are not eligible for funding:

- for-profit companies
- individuals
- injury recovery / disability support for a small number of specific individuals
- · initiatives outside of B.C.
- dry grads To access road safety resources please connect with the ICBC Road Safety & Community Coordinator for your region
- driver training for individual drivers
- transportation services, including shuttles and volunteer driver services
- religious or political organizations
- · lobbyists or special interest groups

## **Submitting an application**

- 1. Review the eligibility criteria above to ensure that both your initiative and organization are eligible.
- 2. Complete the application form starting on page 2. If you have any questions, email community@icbc.com.
  - An organization may submit one application per year.
  - Responses must be included for all information requested.
  - Incomplete applications will have a lower priority for funding or may be declined as a result of missing information.
  - Consider carefully the specific information you enter into each section.
  - Ensure that primary mandate of organization, primary objectives and major activities are entered into the correct boxes.
  - The review of proposals will include assessment of:
    - Clarity and completeness
    - Level of focus on road safety or injury recovery / disability support
    - Value of the concept to the community
    - Likelihood of success based on the plan for the initiative
    - Involvement of other relevant stakeholders
