## Vehicle registration & licensing

## Towing with industrial vehicles

Backhoes, graders, tractors, loaders, forklifts, excavators and similar industrial vehicles can tow trailers, implements, and other vehicles if the towed trailer, implement or other vehicle is unladen and does not exceed a gross vehicle weight (GVW) of 5500 kg.



## **Key points**

Industrial vehicles must not operate with a load while travelling on highway to and from worksites, as set out in the *Motor Vehicle Act* (MVA) and the industrial vehicle licence.

Towing an empty trailer or other vehicle is not a laden operation, as long as the towed vehicle does not rest an appreciable part of its weight on the towing vehicle or exceed 5500 kg GVW. This means industrial vehicles may not tow a semi-trailer or "gooseneck", but they may tow other empty trailers and un-laden vehicles that do not exceed 5500 kg GVW.

Regulations respecting trailer connections, towed vehicles, and brakes apply.

### What's new?

Previously, operators of industrial vehicles licensed with an "X plate" may have been advised that they could not tow on highway, except for towing an un-laden, B.C. licensed motor vehicle used to return from a worksite, for example if the industrial vehicle is to be left at a remote work location. Now, ICBC recognizes that towing is not necessarily a laden operation.

## What does this mean for operators?

Operators can get equipment to and from a job site more efficiently by towing. For example, an X-plated vehicle can tow a licensed implement to use at their jobsite, they do not necessarily require a separate driver and truck or truck and trailer to transport the implement.

## What about the licence?

Industrial vehicles continue to be registered and licensed for un-laden travel to and from worksites. While operating with this licence they must display the "X-plate" issued for the vehicle by ICBC.





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### What about other operating authorities?

Industrial vehicles may be operated under different operating authorities, including other licences (farm tractor, restricted plate, or special fleet) a temporary or quarterly permit, and exemptions in the MVA or *Commercial Transport Act* (CTA).

If the industrial vehicle is being used solely for farming, the farm tractor licence may be more appropriate, as laden operation is allowed for specified situations. More information is available from the <u>Farm vehicles on the move</u> brochure. Owners also may discuss options with an Autoplan broker.

Industrial equipment under 1600 kg may also be licensed under the Restricted plate program. This program and associated permit requirements are described in the <u>Operation permit (MV1815)</u> <u>information sheet</u>.

An industrial vehicle may be listed as a fleet vehicle on a special licence for vehicles used in industry, as provided for in the MVA. With this special licence, the industrial vehicle is still subject to the same "no-load" operating restriction of the industrial vehicle licence, however instead of an "X-plate" it will display the regular commercial floater number plate that was issued to the fleet.

Temporary operation permits are available from Autoplan brokers and commercial non-resident quarterly permits are available from the <a href="Provincial Permit Centre">Provincial Permit Centre</a>; the "no-load" restrictions apply.

In limited situations, there are MVA exemptions on registration, licensing, number plate display, and ICBC insurance, as described in <u>Vehicle registration and licensing bulletin 8</u>. A similar exemption applies under the CTA for operations within highway construction project boundaries, or operation on behalf of the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure or a municipality while maintaining or repairing or snow plowing a highway.
